

Cuyama Valley Planning Committee

June 14, 2005

Ron Thrower opened the meeting and introduced Bob Quirk as moderator. Bob asked that people have their name put on the white board for permission to speak. Most members of the group expressed their opinions as to how the group should proceed in order to accomplish our goals.

John Kidd passed out a proposal of a 5 person board to organize the development of a plan and have 5 standing committees plus any additional committees as needed to do whatever is necessary for the development of the plan in each particular area. People could volunteer to help on whichever committee they have expertise or interest. The areas were air quality, water, zoning, agriculture, and transportation. No action was taken. It was also decided to name the committee the Cuyama Valley Planning Committee.

Jim Revelery proposed and Jenny Stith seconded to have committees for specific purposes. Judy and John Kidd volunteered to take air quality. Gene Zannon volunteered for a steering committee. Ann Cereghino volunteered for the water committee and would help on the steering committee. Jim Revelery, John and Judy Kidd, Bob Quirk, also volunteered to be on the steering committee. A Troesh ad hoc committee was formed to meet after the close of the meeting.

Pam Doiron volunteered to look into developing a web site for the Cuyama Valley Planning Committee and report back at the next meeting. Mike Knowland volunteered to report back at the next meeting on how to put a "Plan" together. Mike had also acquired several booklets concerning community issues that he will put in the library to be checkout. Ann Cereghino also volunteered to allow a P.O. box in the town site be used for CVPC communications.

The group developed an agenda for the next meeting on July 12, 2005, 7:00 at the Rec. Hall. The agenda includes: 1. Report from Troesh Committee and steering committee. 2.
